Sexual Offences

Notable Sexual Offences cases

R v W (Chelmsford Crown Court)

acquitted of multiple incident counts relating to allegations dating back to 1968.

R v K (Stoke-on-Trent Crown Court)

24-year-old man acquitted of rape, x2 causing prostitution for gain and perverting the course of justice.

R v S (St Albans Crown Court)

successfully defended a 16-year-old boy accused of rape following a retrial.

R v C (Peterborough Crown Court)

acquittal of a man accused of assaulting a female whilst she was drunk and unconscious.

R v P (St Albans Crown Court, sitting at Huntingdon)

acquittal of man charged with assault by penetration.

R v J (Swindon Crown Court)

man extradited from Australia to stand trial in relation to historic sexual offences.

Violence

Instructed as junior alone in a range of cases involving allegations of serious violence, including conspiracy to commit GBH, violent disorder, false imprisonment, child cruelty and robbery.

R v K (Kingston Crown Court)

acquitted of robbery and assault.

R v R (Warwick Crown Court)

Cruelty to a person under 16 years.

R v W (Birmingham Crown Court)

teenager with Autism Spectrum Disorder acquitted of s.18 having accepted that he stabbed a vulnerable man three times.

R v F (Birmingham Crown Court)

multi-handed trial involving possession of a firearm with intent to endanger life, affray, and having an offensive weapon.

R v T (Chelmsford Crown Court)

acquittal of a man charged with controlling and coercive behaviour in an intimate family relationship, and religiously aggravated assault by beating.

R v Y (Bournemouth Crown Court)

acquittal of 21-year-old man alleged to have travelled from London to Bournemouth to supply drugs. The Crown said that he had done so not through compulsion but through choice, despite the conclusive grounds stating that the man had been a victim of modern slavery.

R v R (Luton Crown Court)

acquitted of causing death by dangerous driving of two individuals travelling on a horse and trap on a dual carriageway.

Fraud

Instructed in cases of fraud involving local authorities and corporations.
